

What happens during a rain storm?






Separate storm sewers ONLY receive stormwater.






Clogged Grating Impacts on Water Flow







The more plugged a grate is, the less water can pass through it causing the water to rise and flood the street.




Street Flooding Calls (May 2021)

According to the same rain gauge 1.65" fell on 5/9 0.74" fell on 5/26 0.79" fell on 5/28




Please note that the longer a dry period the more opportunity for debris to accumulate.



Street Sweeping Amounts








Average of 2543 tons per year.


