WHAT RAIN BARRELS ARE.

They are an easy way to improve water quality by collecting and storing rainwater runoff from your rooftop.

WHY USE RAIN BARRELS?

They capture stormwater for later use on your lawn and garden before it runs off to open water or overloads the storm sewer system.

BENEFITS OF A RAIN BARRELS.

They reduce stormwater pollution, save you money, and improve the health of our local waterways.

ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

As development and impervious surfaces expand so does the amount of stormwater runoff. Excess stormwater can carry pollutants to open water, overload the sewer system, and increase the potential for stream bank erosion.

In this workshop you will learn how to improve water quality by using a rain barrel on your property AND you will make your very own rain

barrel to take home and start your process of improving the quality of our water resources.

Registration is required and there will be a \$20 fee due upon arrival at the workshop via cash or check made out to the St. Joseph River Watershed Initiative.
