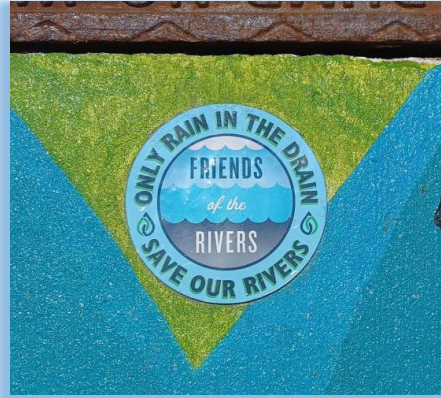

Storm Water Program Goals



Fort Wayne City Utilities is involved in a program designed to clean urban stormwater to protect streams and rivers.

- Educate and inform the public about urban runoff.
- Encourage public participation in community clean-up events.
- Work with industries and businesses to encourage pollution prevention.
- Require all construction projects 1) to be designed to reduce and prevent pollution, 2) to implement good housekeeping practices and 3) to continue those practices and controls even after construction is completed.

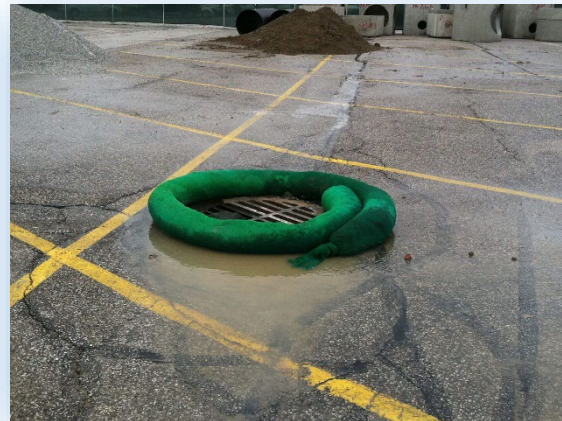

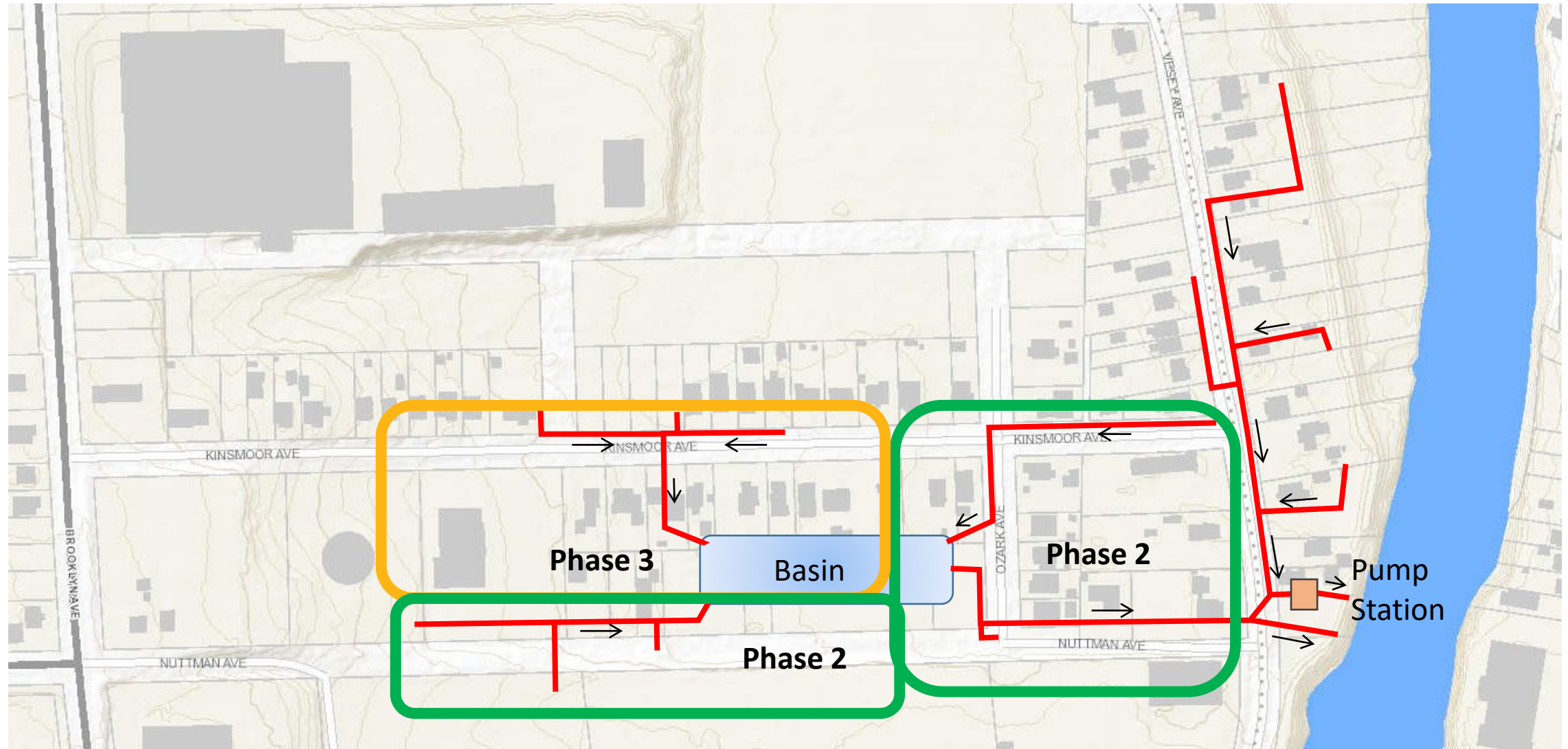
Project Goals

What you can expect to see during construction



- Construction will occur mostly in grass areas off the road to allow for traffic to flow.
- As pipe is laid under driveways, there will be temporary private driveway restrictions.
- Contractor will notify homeowners before they temporarily restrict the use of resident driveways.
- Homeowners will have a CUE and Contractor contact for concerns.
